Volumen toolkit


This toolkit consists of five (5) adaptable modules with non-formal education activities for frontline individuals working or interacting with volunteers and/or individuals involved in collective group activities.

Budget Review

Income

In 2023, GH achieved significant success across various funding sources. Notably, our participation in Erasmus projects was exceptional, with a 100% proposal acceptance rate. Additionally, we successfully obtained two (2) grants from Greek foundations and retained the collaboration and support of the Women's Mediterannean Fund. Furthermore, we secured funding from the Ministry of Education.

The 2023 fundraising efforts have secured the necessary budget for the smooth operation of GH throughout the year and established a strong financial foundation for 2024, allowing us to hire an additional team member.



A. Children



1. Synai/no for primary school students

Synai/no for primary school is one of Genderhood's non-formal education programs on consent, self-determination, and body autonomy, which are part of inclusive sexuality education. This experiential workshop promotes gender equality and seeks to create a safe space for children to interact freely and share personal experiences. Children explore and define consent through experiential games, practice ways to express their "yes" and "no" and create a table with their

consensual greetings, and personal safe buble.

2. Synaino for high school students.

Synai/no for high school is one of Genderhood's non-formal education programs on consent, selfdetermination, and body autonomy, which are part of inclusive sexuality education. This workshop seeks to prevent incidents of genderbased violence and abuse in the underage population and promotes gender equality. Through role-play and brainstorming, children practice different ways of expressing consent in their daily lives. They discover how to communicate their feelings about their bodies, needs, and desires, to respect boundaries and respond appropriately when consent is not given.

3. Are you online?

The educational program explores gender representations in the media and social media, focusing on educating middle school students about gender issues and social privileges. Its goal is to promote gender equality, deconstruct stereotypes, and develop critical thinking. At the same time, it aims to inspire teenagers to take an active stance against gender inequality.

4. Mpertes Anemistires 8-10 y.o.

The educational program Mpertes Anemistires is about gender stereotypes during the Carnival. Based on the fairy tale by Lina Mousioni (Metaixmio editions), the workshop invites children to step into the role of the heroine and the hero, opening the discussion about colours, appearance and gender choices.

5. Seasaw of equality 4-6 y.o.

The educational program explores gender representations in the media and social media, focusing on educating middle school students about gender issues and social privileges. Its goal is to promote gender equality, deconstruct stereotypes, and develop critical thinking. At the same time, it aims to inspire teenagers to take an active stance against gender inequality.

6. Let's talk about consent - WOW festival

Genderhood coordinated an open discussion on consent and the recognition of abusive and transgressive behaviours at the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center, with over 600 high school students and facilitated 3 Synai/no workshops for Primary School students.



B. Adults & children



1. Synaino for parents

Synai/no for parents is one of Genderhood's seminars on consent, self-determination, body autonomy, and gender equality for parents with children 6-12 years old. The seminar aims to empower and educate parents on the above concepts and to integrate them into the upbringing of children, thus preventing incidents of possible sexual abuse.


2. My body, my rules, Intergenerational workshop

In collaboration with the Australian Embassy, Genderhood conducted three intergenerational non-formal educational workshops. Based on Jayneen Sanders's book "My Body! What I Say Goes!", created a safe space for parents and their children to explore the significance of consent and body autonomy.

European Projects



Through the PRESS project, we aim to respond to the growing need to support survivors of these forms of gender-based violence. <u>PRESS</u> is a two-year project (February 2022 – January 2024) and is being implemented with the Diotima Centre as coordinator and the Department of Communication and Mass Media of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens and Genderhood as partners, in collaboration with the Greek Ombudsman and the Association of Social Workers of Greece (SKLE).

At the <u>PRESS project</u>, Genderhood contributed to the advocacy text, <u>the awareness campaign</u> #me_enoxleis, and produced the <u>guide of good practices</u> focused on consent for professionals and held empowerment cycles for adolescents. Genderhood also conducted one (1) workshop for 18 educators and five (5) for 97 high school students.



TThe project <u>VOLUMEN</u> – VOLUnteering for inclusive DevelopMENt aims to promote and encourage non-profit organizations in gender mainstreaming in all their voluntary activities, through the development of an action plan that will contribute to sustainable gender equality.

Generhood held three (3) <u>community-based workshops</u> to 40 professionals, ran the <u>awareness</u> <u>campaign for gender equality</u> #raiseVolumen, and developed and distributed the <u>toolkit for Gender</u> <u>Unbiased Volunteering</u>.
